## FACE Updates

Cristina Melendez, EdD, Executive Director FACE <u>cmelendez15@schools.nyc.gov</u>

Joined by DC Lloyd and Jesse Mojica, Deputy Executive Director FACE

- Melendez greeted CPAC and briefly discussed updates that will be shared in the forthcoming presentation before handing them over to Mojica.
- Mojica greeted CPAC and extended congratulations to Co-Chair Aubin for her recent appointment to the Panel for Educational Policy (PEP)
- Congratulations to CEC 9 were also shared in celebration of their historic town hall.
- Family Leadership Coordinators (FLCs) continue to receive support and professional development FACE has recently instituted office hours to enhance partnership between the district offices and central.
- As FACE continues to restructure there is a concerted effort to broaden partnerships and work more closely with adjacent agencies, community-based organizations (CBOs), faith-based partners, etc.
- FACE is hosting Parent Coordinator (PC) training so that PCs can explain to new families what they're entitled to with respect to any specific needs, busing, transportation, housing, etc.
- Melendez addressed D28s question regarding ongoing harassment of specific parent leaders.
- Melendez asked that parents and families notify FACE of incidents where 911 or ACS are weaponized against students, parents, and families.
- Additional parent leadership trainings are being formulated and will be shared in coming months.

## Settle's Not so Secret Gems – Financing cont'd & Fundraising

- Settle took CPAC through a "Myth or Fact" (true or false) exercise to debunk common misconceptions among parent leaders.
- Financial reporting is **required** interim financial report (mid-year), year-end financial report, and fundraising activity reports

These should be completed after every single fundraising event and kept with financial records.

- Fundraising Activity Reports should be incorporated into the monthly Treasurer reports presented to membership at general monthly meetings.
- Petty Cash is strictly forbidden by CR A-660
- PA/PTAs are not required to use DOE approved vendors.
- Fundraisers outside of instructional time are scheduled and held at the discretion of PA/PTAs *Fundraisers during instructional time are limited to 2x per school year with the approval of the principal.*
- Certain types of fundraising initiatives (e.g., flea markets, door to door sales, etc.) are prohibited *These are listed in CR A-660*
- Reimbursements should be included in your budgets if not, then these should also be approved by membership

All reimbursements must be paid by check.

- "Middleman" financial institutions (e.g., Cash-App) are strictly prohibited all funds should go <u>directly</u> into the PA/PTA bank account.
- Treasurer's Reports ideally encompass all financial activity taking place in the 30-days between meetings or the 30-day period between one report to the next
- Build trust between the Executive Board and general members by being clear and very intentional in all conversations regarding money.
- Settle shared a document specific to raffles this document can be found on the NYC DOE website.
- All fundraising activities should be connected directly to the needs of the <u>entire</u> school (i.e., not just the graduating 5<sup>th</sup> grade class)
- Good record-keeping allows future executive boards to successfully forecast fundraising initiatives.
- Consider creating committees executive boards do not have to do all the work *Delegate responsibility and build capacity for leadership in the community.*

## **NYCPS Chancellor David C. Banks**

Represented by cabinet members: ED Dr. Cristina Melendez, DC Kenita Lloyd, 1<sup>st</sup> DC Weisberg, Emma Vadehra, and Chief of High Schools Elaine Lindsey

Chancellor Banks was absent and testifying at the NYC Council

- DC Lloyd thanked CPAC members for their continued tireless dedication to the students, parents, and families that make up NYCPS.
- Lloyd discussed Spring 2023 launch of NYC Reads NYCPS's new approach to teaching literacy and noted that over 1M students have accessed Sora (NYCPS digital library)
- In a continued effort to reimagine student pathways to careers, NYCPS has launched Future Ready NYC and modern youth apprenticeship initiatives.
- These initiatives are in partnership with CUNY and SUNY as well as Google, Chase, and other corporations to increase college access and reimagine the high school experience.
- NYCPS launched "innovative safety programs" like Project Pivot and Safer Access Initiative
- Bilingual programs have been expanded 77 new programs have been opened since the Fall.
- NYCPS has supported >29,000 new students in temporary housing into our schools.
- "Successful" second year of Summer Rising NYCPS served over 100,000 (~144,000) students in summer 2023.
- NYCPS has begun prioritizing MWBE spending
- NYCPS is attempting to address the need for mental health support for teenagers and have launched health supports like mindful breathing initiatives, TeenSpace (13-17yo can connect to a licensed therapist via BetterHelp for ongoing support)

All of this has been done in partnership with the UFT training staff on mindfulness practices with a special focus on mindful breathing.

- NYCPS is "harnessing the power of virtual learning and AI" and working toward MS and HS students being able to opt-in to online coursework.
- NYCPS with input from students continues to work to enhance the school lunch experience.
- NYCPS continues to revise the Fair Student Funding (FSF) formula to be more equitable.
- DC Lloyd wished everyone a happy holiday season.
- Vadehra addressed D28s question regarding projected mid-year budget cuts to D75 *This question will be answered more fully at the January meeting.*
- Vadehra addressed D08s question and statement regarding "chronic absenteeism" as it is connected to busing and student transportation.

- Vadehra addressed a question from the chat regarding looming budget cuts and the effect of the budget reductions on 3K and Pre-K programs.
- DC Weisberg addressed a question from the chat regarding College Now and noted that NYCPS is actively working to continuously improve the program in partnership with CUNY.
- Vadehra addressed BX HS questions regarding OPT contracts, ride-share, support for students and families, etc.
- Vadehra addressed a question from the YouTube livestream regarding recommendations set forth by the Class Size Reduction Working Group and potential implementation of these recommendations.
- Lindsey addressed a question from the chat regarding the trend of high school students not receiving their mandated special education services.
- DC Weisberg addressed a question from the chat regarding enrollment and transportation for newcomer students.
- Vadehra addressed D28s question regarding how funds allocated to D75 students and other sensitive student populations are protected.
- DC Weisberg addressed BxHS question regarding the weaponization of 911 and ACS by schools against parents and families

*Co-chair Aubin noted that this has been an on-going problem, and it is also used to silence parent leaders.*

- Harlem MagicMasters Int'l, Inc. (HMM) is an entertainment basketball team they offer in-school programs including assemblies, basketball clinics, family fun nights, Title I programs, pep rallies, etc.
- HMM also helps schools roll out Project Pivot initiatives.
- All programs are themed themes address and center anti-bullying, respect for all, chronic absenteeism, etc.
- HMM does not limit the number of students who can participate in their programs.
- HMM partners directly with the school or PA/PTA to ensure that messaging is consistent and that whatever mission or goal associated with the event is highlighted.
- HMM offers mentoring sessions for elementary through high school students and students with disabilities *Mentoring sessions can be combined with basketball clinics.*
- Assemblies can be reserved back-to-back i.e., 9am for Pre-K to  $1^{st}$  grade, 10:30am for  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  grade, 12pm for  $4^{th}$  and  $5^{th}$  grade, etc.
- HMM is fully insured (\$2M liability policy)
